Job Summary:

The Instructor will be responsible for training adult participants of varying levels during a 4 month "Sewing for Jobs" sewing course as well as taking on the role of Lead Teacher for public courses. Following a detailed curriculum, the Program Instructor will teach, support and assist sewing trainees in their progress towards becoming professional seamstresses.

Specific Areas of Responsibility:

- Coordinate all the sewing training for the training course.
- Plan and facilitate sewing training for participants, a minimum of 3 hours per day, 5 days a week including some evenings and weekends
- Assist participants to improve their sewing skills in garment construction, Repair/Alterations and Home Décor.
- Request sewing supplies and machine repair/parts as needed.
- Ensure participant adherence to policies and procedures in accordance with the applicable legislation EE policies, City of Ottawa requirements, and demands of the funders of the project.
- Perform ongoing assessment of trainee progress and assist the Program Manager/Executive Director in project data collection.
- Maintain appropriate project documentation (curriculum updates, exams, attendance, handouts).
- Administration and coordination of Public Course delivery in collaboration with ED, Content Strategist, and Program Manager
- Liaise with Public Course teachers and students to ensure effective course delivery
- Teach 2 Public courses per semester
- Perform any additional relevant tasks and duties as assigned by the Executive Director.
